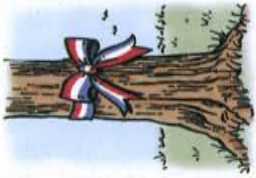

BETTY THOMPSON HOLT

February 16, 1931 -
November 21, 2011

Mrs. Betty Holt, long time member of Prospect Baptist Church, died on November 21, 2011, after a long illness. Mrs. Holt was preceded in death by her husband, Carlton (Buddy) Holt, who was mayor of Albemarle at one time. She was the daughter of Joseph Walter and Connie Goodman Thompson. A little bit of history that includes Prospect Baptist Church: Connie Thompson Carroll, Betty's grandmother, *at the time of her death in 2000*, was the oldest living member and had held the longest (of living members) membership at Prospect Baptist Church. The wood that was used to make the pews in the "old" sanctuary, before the ones that were recently given away, came from Connie's farm on Hearne Road. A lot of the stained glass windows (James and Etta Goodman and others) were donated by members of the Goodman/Thompson/Holt Family members. James and Etta Goodman were Betty's maternal grandparents. The *original* PBC chimes were donated by the Holt's in honor of her mother, Connie Carroll. The late Mr. Carlton (Buddy) Holt was instrumental in the formation of the Prospect Baptist Church Cemetery Trust Fund. Memorials: Hospice of Stanly County or the Stanly County Library.
